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• CRAFT/PROFESSION

Fallone LECLERRE creates micro macramé costume jewellery and decorative items. The technique involves knotting waxed cord which is both strong and durable, ensuring the knots hold fast over time. Micro macramé is used to create intricate and delicate designs worked on shaped aluminium wire. Fallone's favourite raw materials are all natural: cotton cord, stone, wood and shells.

• BACKGROUND

Fallone is a native of Bourail and her hometown remains her professional base. She studied for a BTS diploma in business unit management and worked for a time in this field.

In her spare time, she began making jewellery, firstly for herself and then for her friends. Fallone taught herself the skills she needed for her beloved craft, following tutorials to help perfect her technical

expertise. She then launched her product range on Facebook.

She got such an enthusiastic response that she decided to open the "Amarok" craft boutique she now runs in Bourail.
