Sandy KAMIDIN designs handcrafted macramé items: dream catchers, decorative wall and ceiling hangings; fashion accessories including bags, belts and costume jewellery; decorative homeware including mirrors, bedside lamps, hanging lanterns and wall hangings or boho-style tapestries and curtains or hammocks in natural ecru or brightly coloured cotton.

She uses braided cotton yarn, wool yarn, driftwood, wooden beads, ribbon, raffia, feathers, shells and semi-precious stones in her designs.

BACKGROUND

In her teens, Sandy was already fascinated by the world of arts and crafts. She started by making her own fashion jewellery then, as a fan of boho-chic, fell love with macramé.

Before embarking on a career as a self-taught craftswoman, Sandy took a vocational high school diploma in secretarial work and worked in administration. However, driven by curiosity and creative passion, she honed her theoretical and practical skills by watching endless tutorials on YouTube and checking out blogs. The idea of turning her beloved hobby into a full-time job grew and finally became reality when she launched her own company and brand Nimpy, which means dream in Javanese...
