CRAFT/PROFESSION

Anne-Christine GILODI creates origami jewellery and decorative items: earrings, mobiles, decorated envelopes and pop-up cards.



Origami is the ancestral Japanese art of delicate paper folding. The basic origami shape is a folded square but many other sculptural art forms can be created. Origami folds can be combined in a variety of ways to make intricate designs; cutting the paper is generally discouraged.





BACKGROUND

As the daughter of an artisan, Anne-Christine spent a lot of time in her father's carpentry workshop and at craft markets. She grew up with a fascination for handcrafting skills. Later, she gained great pleasure from leading workshops to encourage both young and old to explore new arts activities developing their creativity and working with a variety of recycled materials. She was passionate about all kinds of creative work: wood carving, painting, beads, modelling... turning her talent and perfecting her skills in each.

Origami became Anne-Christine's favourite technique after a visit to Japan where she was able to obtain the perfect Japanese washi papers she needed.
